The ZHdK has had a series of Exhibtions "Labor" in collaboration with the Kunstmuseum Thun, the Elia Conferences in Zürich have also tested little "in situ presentations", most recently the Projects RhyCycling — Grenzraum im Fluss (http://rhycycling.idk.ch FHNW), Basel, Just Architecture (HSLU) in Schweizerische Architektur Museum (www.justarchitecture.ch), Basel Präparat Bergsturz (HKB) in Kunstmuseum Chur and the symposium "Performing the exhibition" in the Chateau Mercier (ECAV) Sierre, have referred to or been part of artistic research projects.
